"My son and I were finishing up a great day of detecting with our *AT Max*. We had already found two silver Mercury dimes, a War nickel spill and three separate sterling silver rings.

"After 6 hours we were exhausted but we always swing our way back to the truck. A few feet from the road, we got a scratchy 70 signal. Being close to the road, we were expecting garbage but couldn't resist one last hole. About 5 inches down we dug an amazing 1870s Indian War era eagle infantry button in amazing condition! The coolest part was that it was worn as a necklace and the intact (still clasped) chain was attached!

"Like most detectorists we like to imagine the story behind our finds. We can imagine a widow wearing it in remembrance of her husband or a wife wearing it while waiting for her husband to return from war. Another amazing piece of history saved with our *AT Max*!"

Garrett's Code of Detecting Ethics

Charles Garrett always urged his fellow searchers to conduct themselves as responsible treasure hunters and to leave their hunt areas in better condition than they found them. Please follow your local directives during the current health crisis, but when you are able to safely enjoy detecting, here are just a few of his keys to good conduct in the field:



- Never trespass or hunt on private property without permission.
- National and state parks/monuments, etc. are absolutely off-limits.
- Always fill in every hole that you dig.
- Do not leave litter or other discarded junk items lying around.
- Always carry out all rubbish and dug targets with you when you leave a search area.
- Use reasonable caution in digging toward any target, particularly in areas where you are uncertain of the ground conditions.
- Keep informed on and obey all local and national legislation relating to the discovery and reporting of found treasures.
